Ashkenazi Jewish Heritage Profile Information Sheet

There are currently eleven genetic diseases which are found more commonly in the Ashkenazi Jewish population and for which carrier status prenatal testing is recommended. Two of these tests* have only been available in the past five years, two have been added only recently*** and many years ago only one test was available**.

It is recommended that all patients at risk who are planning a pregnancy, or are currently pregnant, be tested to see whether they are carriers for these diseases:

Bloom Syndrome, Canavan Disease, Cystic Fibrosis, Familial Dysautonomia*, Fanconi Anemia, Gaucher Disease, Glycogen Storage Disease***, Maple Syrup Urine Disease***, Moculipidosis Type IV*, Niemann-Pick Disease, Tay-Sachs Disease**
